Our vision to eliminate preventable deaths and disabilities from sudden cardiac arrest by 2030 is a tribute to the over 23,000 families whose child is lost to SCA each year. ## Our Programs



### **Heart to Heart**

Our national platform for change is an annual springboard for community programs across 40 states. Without a national standard for SCA prevention for youth, this educational event shares innovative and effective working models that provide real-time solutions to fill this gap in health and safety protocol in youth communities. It has catalyzed the provision of hundreds of thousands of free or low-cost services and has informed new research, pilots and prevention policies.

### Advocacy

We educate change makers in school, sports and medical communities on the critical need for better SCA prevention anywhere youth congregate. We forge meaningful partnerships that inform thousands of professionals across the country. We track youth lost to SCA, which helped catalyze the Sudden Death in the Young Case Registry. We partner on research studies to affect policy change and co-author statements and resources to highlight the critical need to change the standard of care.

### Get Charged Up

As co-author with 12 national health and safety organizations of the Cardiac Emergency Response Plan (CERP) for Schools, we created this program to mentor school health professionals to implement a CERP on their campus, which earns them a free AED and accessories. We partner with the National Association of School Nurses, AED manufacturers, distributors and other vendors to help create heart safe campuses.

#### CERPs include:

- Team trained in recognition of SCA, CPR & use of AED
- Written school CERP
- Accessible & maintained AED
- Emergency response drills
- Communication with EMS & school community



# Take the Prevention Promise

National call-to-action campaigns educate communities and equip hundreds of thousands with free SCA prevention resources for families, schools, teams, community centers, workplaces and medical practices. Through social media, printed and digital tools, articles, videos and more, we mobilize the next generation of lifesavers to recognize the incidence of SCA in youth and demand comprehensive cardiac risk assessment and cardiac preparedness to protect young hearts in youth communities.

# Highlights of 2021



### Learn Life-Saving Skills From Home: Protect Young Hearts Across the Country

A key pillar of our Vision 2030 is to empower the public to respond to a cardiac emergency. CPR alone can triple an SCA victim's chance of survival and using an AED within the first minute of collapse can increase survival as high as 90%. That's why PHW partnered with the Health & Safety Institute (HSI) to offer HSI's Remote Skills Verification (RSV) training technology for First-Aid, CPR and AED. The program features:

- Full 2-year certification from home or work
- Interactive, remote, online learning
- Hands-on skills training
- Live instructors provide real-time feedback

Participants receive a discounted rate for the course, with that savings donated back to support our national movement to raise the standard of care.



# Keeping Kids' Hearts in the Game

Parent Heart Watch partnered with the Eric Paredes Save A Life Foundation and Coach Safely, a leader in youth sports injury prevention and education, to create sudden cardiac arrest prevention training for youth sports communities. The training is available to teams to support compliance with state sudden cardiac arrest prevention and sports safety laws, as well as anyone committed to comprehensive health and safety standards to protect young athletes.

A pre-and post-quiz measures improvement in SCA awareness, warning signs, risk factors and what to do in a cardiac emergency.

Average quiz scores increased from 69% to 91% after taking this training!

# Highlights of 2021



### Getting Schools Charged Up

In 2021, we doubled the size of our program to place 53 AEDs and implement cardiac emergency response plans (CERP) in schools across the country. To date, our efforts are protecting the hearts of nearly 150,000 students and staff, plus thousands more given an estimated 20% of the population is on a school campus on any given day.

- 32% Schools' 1st AED
- 59% Schools' 1st CERP
- 20% SCA on Campus















# Shaping the Future of ECG Testing

Parent Heart Watch members have provided tens of thousands of data points from their free youth heart screenings to the Prevention of Sudden Cardiac Death in the Young: National Cardiac Screening Warehouse Pilot Study.

Analysis of the data will allow understanding and improvement of



screening efficiency and impact, potentially allow revision of criteria for abnormal ECGs in children, and could ultimately inform making ECG testing part of preventative care.

### New Policy To Heart Screen All Youth

Parent Heart Watch is part of the ongoing dialogue to evolve recommendations from the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) for combating Sudden Death in the Young. Developed by the AAP Section on Cardiology and Cardiac Surgery and the Pediatric and Congenital Electrophysiology Society (PACES) Task Force on Prevention of Sudden Death in the Young, a new 2021 policy offers guidance to help primary care providers identify children with at-risk heart conditions. Providers now have a strategy for screening, evaluating and managing cardiac risk assessment during well-child checks and preparticipation physical evaluations or at least every three (3) years and especially upon entry to middle/junior/high school, regardless of the level of physical activity, which was the previous benchmark, and to use ECG testing to address concerns. While not addressing the asymptomatic child with regular ECG testing, the new guidance is a step forward in preventative care.

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
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
