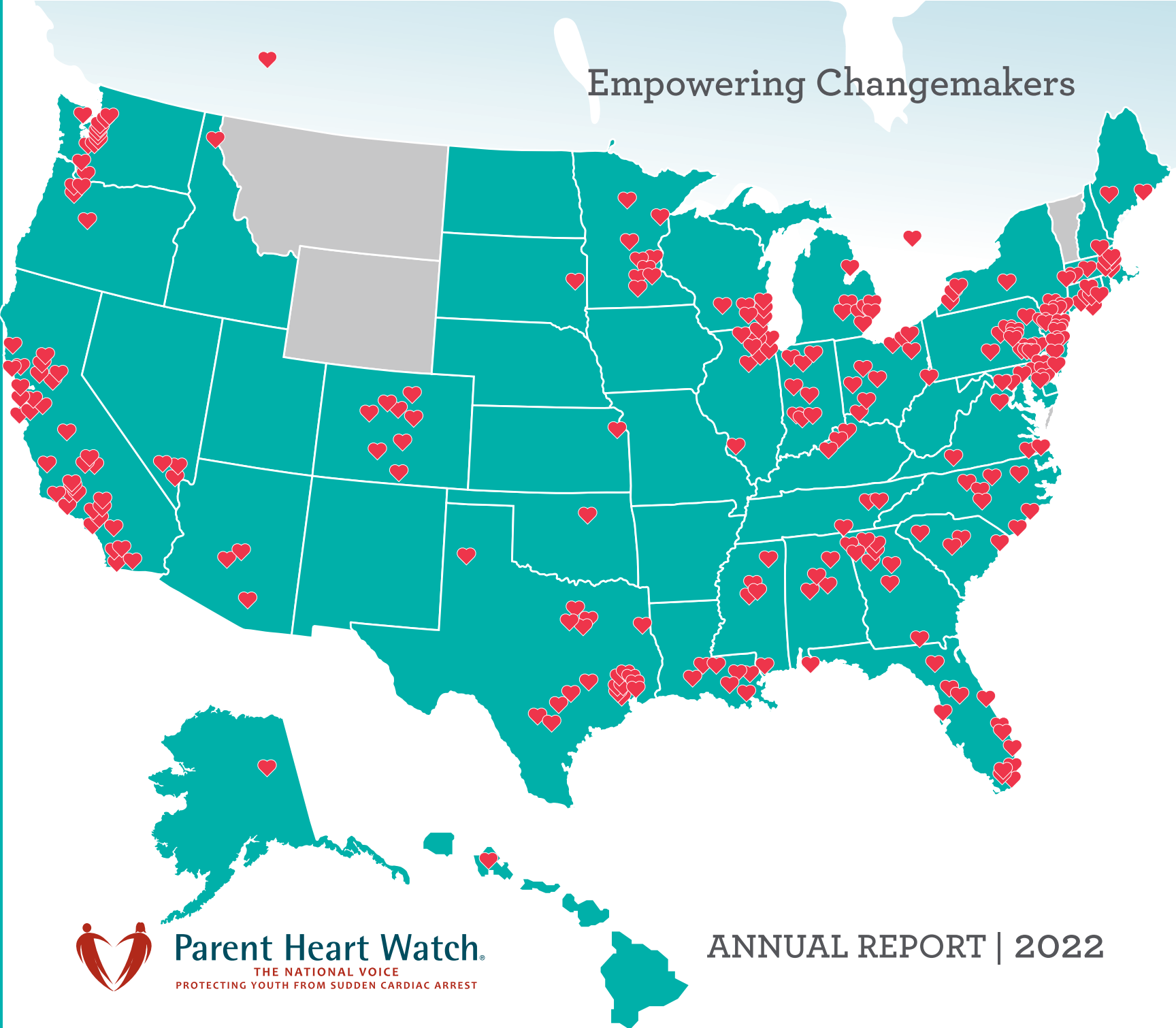

Unlike other public health crises that are still searching for solutions to remedy disease and other health states that claim lives, we have the ability right now to prevent SCA from taking one more young life—but that doesn't happen by chance.

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Empowering Changemakers

What started 17 years ago as a grassroots gathering of families searching for answers to a child lost to sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) has become a national movement to protect young hearts, with a vision to eliminate preventable deaths and disabilities from SCA in youth by 2030.

It's little known that one in 300 youth has an undetected heart condition that puts them at risk for SCA. And yet, the standard of care lacks proven prevention protocol to protect young hearts, evidenced by studies that show standard medical exams miss up to 90% of youth at risk, and once stricken the survival rate is barely 10%, where it has stagnated for the last three decades.

Parent Heart Watch and its member champions are united in a vision to change systemic protocol and policy on how families and communities prepare for and respond to SCA in youth. This remains a marginalized issue, evidenced by:

- ♥ absent and outdated medical policy statements that are not responsive to current data;
- ♥ no national registry to quantify youth stricken;
- ♥ lack of funding to properly equip schools and youth centers; and
- ♥ research-reported under-average deployment of CPR/AEDs on the young.



VISION 2030

TO ELIMINATE PREVENTABLE DEATHS
From Sudden Cardiac Arrest in Youth by 2030

After losing our perfectly healthy 17-year-old son to an undetected heart condition in 2018, I was at a loss for answers. Zac passed every well check, pre-participation sports physical and in 2014 a pediatric heart exam including an ECG and full Echo. The call I made to PHW changed our lives as we finally understood sudden cardiac arrest and that it is NOT rare. We founded the Zac Mago Foundation to provide heart screenings to our youth, an endeavor made possible through the resources and support provided by PHW. Without the PHW family, I would most likely still be searching for answers.

Who is Parent Heart Watch?

We educate and advocate.

After our son, David, died on a five-mile run with the Marines in Hawaii, we asked to see his EKG. It was a shock to learn he had never had one when he went through medical screening, and so his heart condition went undetected. Changing anything in the Department of Defense is impossible without facts and data, and Parent Heart Watch gave us the information our foundation, Lion Heart Heroes, needed to have President Biden sign into the 2022 National Defense Appropriations Act funding for an EKG screening pilot for incoming military academy cadets.

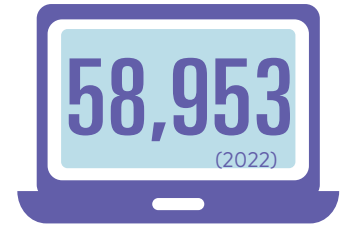

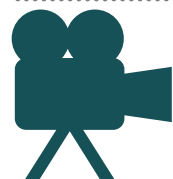

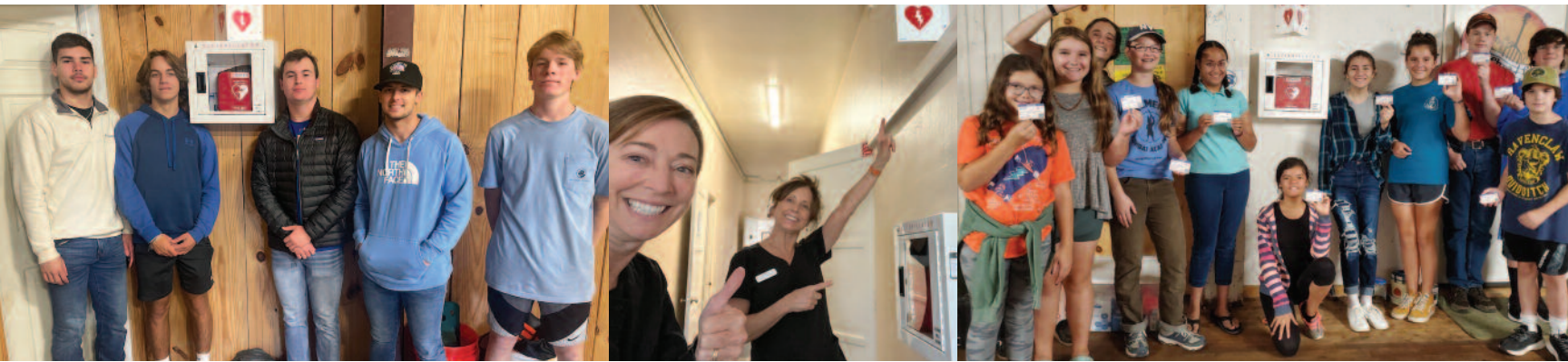

Our Annual National Heart to Heart presents a singular opportunity to advance an initiative to elevate a standard of care that could save thousands of lives annually.

The inspiration and tools to affect this outcome is rooted in a dynamic, three-day educational event where attendees are empowered and equipped by experts and each other to create and sustain community prevention programs that have become effective working models for change (see By The Numbers!) in 40 states.

This national platform has inspired innovative collaborations to find real-time solutions to fill the critical gap in health and safety protocol in youth communities.

SCA Awareness & Education

This national call-to-action campaign educates communities and equips hundreds of thousands with free SCA prevention resources for families, schools, teams, community centers, workplaces and medical practices. Through social media, printed and digital tools, articles, videos and more, we mobilize the next generation of lifesavers to recognize the incidence of SCA in youth and demand comprehensive cardiac risk assessment and cardiac preparedness to protect young hearts in youth communities.



Advocacy: The Voice of SCA in Youth

We forge meaningful partnerships that inform thousands of professionals across the country. We track youth lost to SCA, which helped catalyze the Sudden Death in the Young Case Registry. We partner on research studies to affect

policy change and co-author statements and resources to highlight the critical need to change the standard of care. Through our participation in and presentation at state, national and international working groups and conferences, we create momentum for our vision.

Founded in 2011 by a group of young people who had each been through their own heart-related illness and wanted to share their similar experiences, this program's mission is to provide support, networking and education to young SCA survivors and those living with a heart condition. Improving SCA Survival Rates

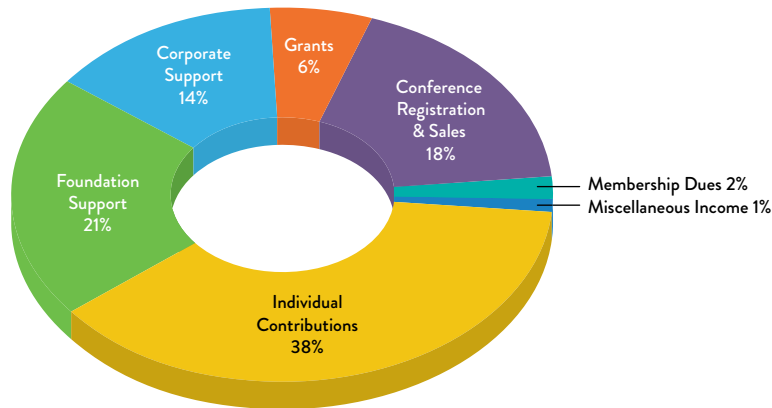

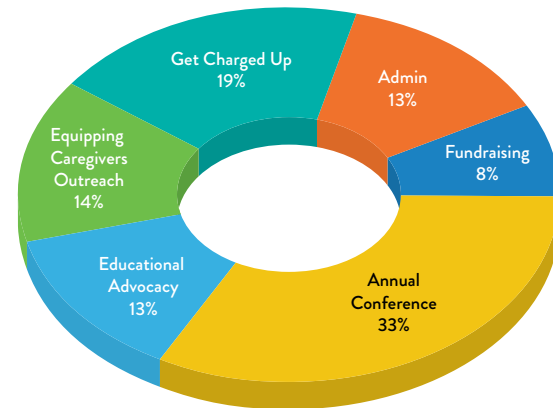
