

As a thought leader in sudden cardiac arrest prevention among children and young adults, Parent Heart Watch remained dedicated to its mission to educate and advocate for stronger

> prevention standards nationwide ensuring safer environments where kids live, learn, and play.

This year, we partnered with the NFL's Smart Heart Sports Coalition to make AEDs more affordable for schools and youth sports teams. We collaborated with the American Heart Association and Project ADAM to enhance a free, evidence-based toolkit for cardiac emergency response planning. Through our engagement with the National Association of School Nurses, we advanced efforts to prioritize cardiac emergency preparedness on school campuses. Additionally, we provided free training on the International Criteria for ECG Interpretation in Athletes.

We began mentoring 22 schools and youth-serving organizations on implementing cardiac emergency response plans, enabling them to earn an AED through our Get Charged Up! program. Looking ahead, we are spearheading the first-ever National Youth Heart Screening Day, joining forces with organizations across 15 states to drive life-saving prevention.

As we approach our 20th anniversary of protecting young hearts, we proudly reaffirm our commitment: Together We Will.

Our Mission

Parent Heart Watch is the leading national organization solely dedicated to protecting children and young adults from sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) and preventable sudden cardiac death (SCD) by educating and advocating for change.

Our Vision

Eliminate preventable deaths and disabilities from sudden cardiac arrest in children and young adults.

Our Focus

Establishing a mandatory registry to accurately track the true incidence of SCA/SCD in youth Improving cardiac risk assessment by recognizing warning signs, risk factors and family heart history—both at home and with medical providers

Promoting early detection of at-risk heart conditions through preventive ECG screening Empowering bystanders to Call-Push-Shock to save a sudden cardiac arrest victim Increasing AED access in schools and other youth-serving organizations to prevent a leading cause of death

Implementing cardiac emergency response plans where kids learn and play Advocating for life-saving legislation and policies to elevate the standard of care

The SCA survival rate is just ~10%, with only ~41% of SCA victims receiving CPR from a bystander and a mere ~12% receiving a shock from a publicly accessible AED. Plus, just a fraction of the country's youth undergo a comprehensive early detection cardiac risk assessment. To save more lives we must make prevention a priority.


Our work is a tribute to the 23,000 families who lose a child to sudden cardiac arrest each year — and a promise to champion prevention for every child, every heart.

Parent Heart Watch's flagship event serves as a powerful platform, inspiring innovative collaborations to bridge critical gaps in youth health and safety protocols. This dynamic, three-day educational experience empowers and equips attendees to develop and sustain community prevention programs that have become national models for change (see By The Numbers).

Medical and allied health professionals, adult and youth advocates and sudden cardiac arrest survivors are honored as Heroes for Young Hearts for their dedication to advancing prevention in their communities. Ultimately, this annual conference drives initiatives to elevate the standard of care, with the potential to save thousands of lives year after year.



Think Tank

In partnership with the Cardiac Safety Research Consortium, Heart to Heart featured a special pre-event: Prevention of Sudden Death in the Young: A Pathway to Survival. The think tank brought together medical, regulatory, industry experts along with individuals impacted by SCA and SCD, to examine barriers, advancements and strategies for establishing a national standard of care.





Inspired by strategic discussions at Heart to Heart, Parent Heart Watch began planning the first-of-its-kind sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) prevention event—a nationwide call to action to screen Every Kid. Every Heart.

Typical well-child checkups and preparticipation physical evaluations miss up to 90% of youth at risk for SCA. For nearly two decades, Parent Heart Watch and its member organizations have advocated for stronger prevention standards through comprehensive heart screenings that include an ECG with physician interpretation, which is known to increase the ability to detect fatal cardiac conditions to 94%.

Slated for the first Saturday of February 2025, this initiative aims to amplify awareness about the reality of SCA in children and young adults, and emphasize the importance of early detection through heart screenings.

Partnering with member organizations across the country to host free screenings for youth ages 12 to 25, the event will also underscore cardiac emergency preparedness by teaching thousands of participants how to perform hands-only CPR and use an automated external defibrillator (AED) to increase the chance of survival from sudden cardiac arrest.





Studies show CERPs can increase the survival rate up to 70%!

Highlights of 2024

As co-author alongside 12 national health and safety organizations of the Cardiac Emergency Response Plan (CERP) and implementation resources for schools, Parent Heart Watch launched Get Charged Up! in 2017 to mentor organizations in implementing a CERP in their facilities. Upon successful implementation, participants earn a free AED and accessories.

Our efforts have been recognized by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as a public access defibrillation (PAD) resource. In 2024, Parent Heart Watch opened its sixth cycle, welcoming 22 new participants.

Through state, national and international working groups and conferences, Parent Heart Watch drives momentum for its vision. As thought-leaders, we have a seat at the table with stakeholders in education, sports, medical and allied health communities, ensuring that youth SCA prevention remains a priority.

Smart Hearts Sports Coalition AEDs for Youth Program

As members of this groundbreaking coalition of like-minded thought leaders driving systemic change in school communities, we are advancing our 19-year vision to eliminate preventable deaths and disabilities from sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) in youth through key initiatives.

To date, 19 states have adopted three evidence-based polices to prevent fatalities from SCA among high school athletes, including:

An athletic emergency action plan that is venue specific, widely distributed, posted, rehearsed, and updated annually. Clearly marked AEDs at each athletic venue or within 1-3 minutes of each venue where high school practices or competitions are held.

CPR and AED education for coaches.

In 2024, Parent Heart Watch played a pivotal role in launching the AEDs for Youth program, making new automated external defibrillators (AEDs) available at substantial discounts to public and private K-12 schools as well as youth sports organizations nationwide.



Call-Push-Shock

The Centers for Disease Control has recognized Call-Push-Shock as a resource for peers, advocates, educators, patients and legislators to promote cardiac emergency preparedness. Our national movement, in collaboration with the Sudden Cardiac Arrest Foundation, champions a universal call to action for laypeople to respond to sudden cardiac arrest. With the support of 57 partners nationwide, we continue to expand our reach. Partners include businesses, nonprofit organizations, EMS agencies, hospital systems, medical associations, municipalities and universities. Given hands-only CPR can triple a victim's chance of survival, and using an AED within the first minutes of collapse can increase survival up to 90%, this campaign empowers everyone to save a life.

Advocacy

Historic HEARTS Act

Parent Heart Watch and its members supported the enactment of Public Law 118-176, known as the HEARTS Act, which amended the Public Health Service Act to enhance education, awareness, risk assessment, research, and prevention efforts related to cardiomyopathy and sudden cardiac arrest (SCA).

In 2024 Parent Heart Watch supported legislation across the country that prioritized various focuses of sudden cardiac arrest prevention:


AED requirement in schools, sporting facilities, stadiums, youth-serving organizations and/or places of public assembly CPR training for school personnel, students,

CPR training for school personnel, students coaches


Cardiac Emergency Response Planning in schools & during athletic games and practices SCA Prevention (warning signs & symptoms, removal from play until cleared by medical professional)

Overall, 26 bills were enacted in AL, CA, CO, GA, HI, IN, KS, KY, LA, MD, MI, MS, NY, OH, OK, TN, TX, VA, WV and Congress.
